

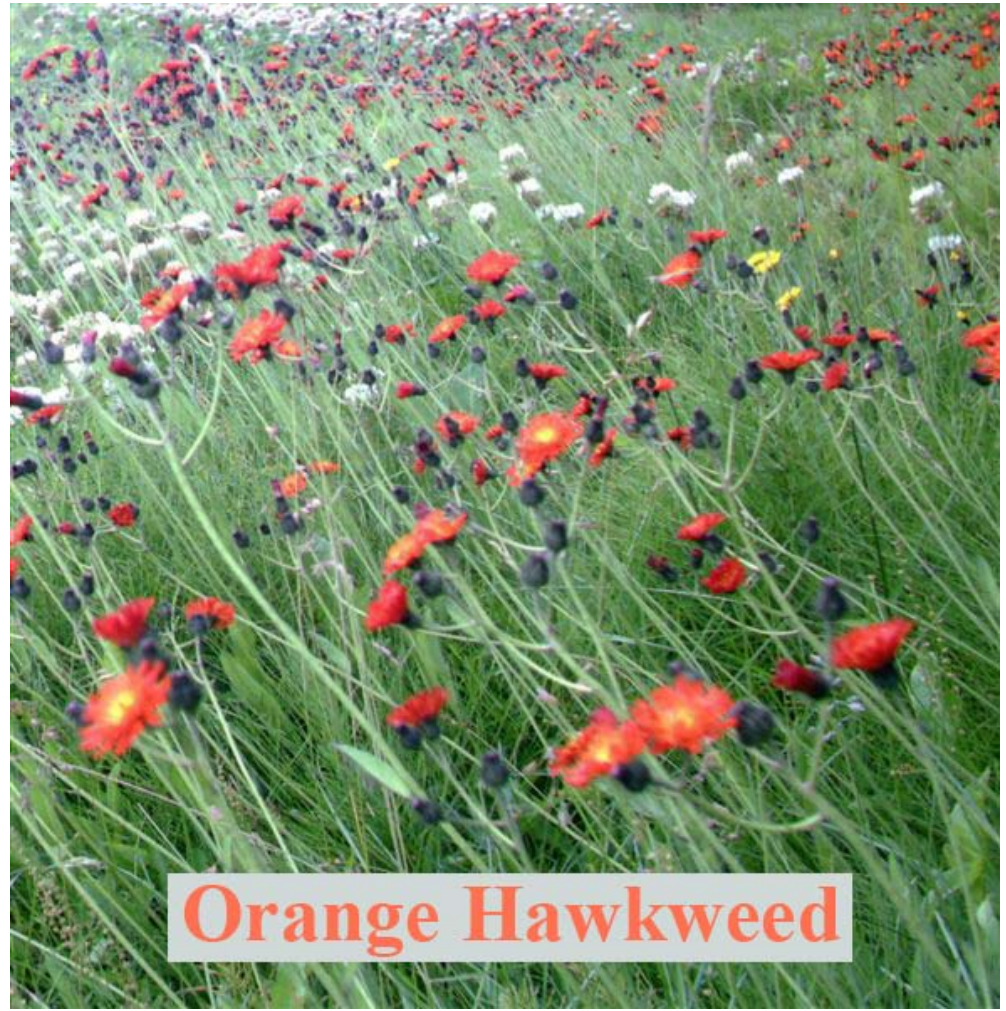
Invasive Plants in Bristol Bay

Invasive Plants have been found in Bristol Bay. Invasive plant species crowd out indigenous plants and cause serious ecological disturbance. By choking out native plant life they effectively remove habitat for indigenous animals and fish, reducing biodiversity. Depending on species they can be very difficult to remove and can negatively impact property values. Invasive plants cost multiple (millions) of dollars nationwide, every year.

The risks to losing our berries, fish, and wild animals are real. Get educated on identifying 'invasives' and report them as soon as possible.
